\$500K for Water System Storage

Tustee Kal Baste, Chairman of the Public Works Committee, reports that work has commenced on our 2 million gallon above ground water tank and the immediate results are visually stunning. In addition, the underground 500,000 gallon tank is receiv-

ing maintenance repairs and will soon be filled with water again and fully operational. All of the painting and repairs are being done to assure our water reservoir is fully optimized for safe operation to carry water from the tank to your home.

When work is completed on the underground and above ground tank the next big project will be painting the water tower. That project will cost nearly 1.5 million dollars and is expected to be completed by the end of 2024.

NEW AMBULANCE APPROVED!

Trustee Higginson chairperson of the Fire Department Committee is happy to report that the Village Board has approved the purchase of a new ambulance for the Bridgeview Fire Department. The fully loaded \$350,000 vehicle will replace an older model in our 4 vehicle fleet. Keeping our fleet up to date is critical to maintaining quick response times for our emergency personnel. The proposed new ambulance was put out for bid to get the most money for our tax dollars. The nearly \$350,000 price was the lowest bid received. However to

everyones disappointment the wait time for a new ambulance is nearly one year. The Fire fleet is in good order and the delay will not hamper the operations.

"As our community continues to grow we need to make sure that our personnel, equipment, and vehicles keep pace to provide the best service possible to our residents," Commented Trustee Higginson. "It is important we continue to invest in our emergency services to ensure our people have the best chance possible to save lives in the future."



Before the crack of dawn, the Bridgeview Police Department was stationed up at 7949 West 79th Street collecting funds for the annual "Cop on a Rooftop" fundraiser. Another Financial Upgrade for Bridgeview

For the second year in a row Fitch Ratings, an international bond rating agency, has upgraded Bridgeview's fi-

nancial rating another step, continuing Bridgeview's upward trend. Mayor Landek and the Village Board of Trustees have continued a disciplined approach to spending, hiring, reve- Mayor Landek nue management and



the maximizing of State and Federal resources leading to consecutive balanced budgets. Bridgeview's "Pay with Cash" policy has kept the village from incurring long-term debt. "It is no surprise that the Village of Bridgeview financial outlook continues to be recognized." said Mayor Landek, "The Village Board and I are working diligently to maintain fiscal responsibility and continue to build a strong economic foundation while providing top of the line public services through our fire, police and public works departments. We are watchful on what we spend but never at the expense of our village infrastructure. We continue to make great strides in rebuilding our roads, improving the safety of our water systems, and bringing new developments into our village."

Last year the Village of Bridgeview General Fund resulted in a surplus of \$2.2 million and the Stadium Fund resulted in a surplus of \$1 million. The Stadium's steady growth of activity has surpassed pre-pandemic levels and is currently home to Major League Rugby's Chicago Hounds, National Women's Soccer League's Chicago Red Stars, and Major League Soccer's Next Pro League's Chicago Fire II team. The stadium is used as a training facility for all aforementioned teams as well as the Chicago Fire first team and youth academy. Bridgeview's Stadium is also set to host high profile music festivals including the Lyrical Lemonade Summer Smash and North Coast Music Fest



this year in addition to hosting the 2023 Major League Rugby Championship. "The outlook on the Village of Bridgeview and stadium will remain strong despite the economic challenges facing the greater U.S. we need to continue to exercise fiscal responsibility for the long term," stated Mayor Landek. "We are on a path to pay down our debts and keep pace with inflation with a minimal impact on our residents when compared to our neighboring suburbs."

KEEP THE WATER FLOWING

Water main breaks are a common occurrence throughout Illinois and it is an unfortunate side effect of our Midwestern weather. It takes a lot to keep the water flowing in Bridgeview but it's necessary to keep our water safe and clean for our residents and industry. The natural shift in seasons causes the soil underground to constantly expand and contract and over time breaks happen. Once a break occurs Bridgeview's water pressure monitoring system sends out a low water pressure alert indicating a break. The monitoring system will give a general location for the break but it is up to crews to identify the exact location. Once the break area is identified crews will locate the nearest shutoff valve to turn off the water to the main and the hard work begins.

Excavators will work to dig a trench about 10' to 15' deep around the water main so crews can comfortably work on replacing the necessary section. Crews

work within a reinforced structure designed to protect them from the earth collapsing onto them. Once the old section of pipe is removed the new one is carefully lowered into the ground and installed. The new pipe is then filled with water then flushed to ensure it is working

Once the pipe is in good working order it is refilled with water and chemically treated as required by State Law. The earth around the break is refilled and if applicable the streets or sidewalks are repaired. "There is a lot of work that goes into replacing our water mains but the end result is a positive for the village. As mains are always replaced with more durable materials than what was used 70 years ago, we are positioning our water system for a long term positive result," said Trustee Mike Pticek, chairperson of the Finance Committee.

INFORMATION SAVES LIVES! DOWNLOAD SMART 911!

9-1-1 call takers play a critical role in the emergency response pipeline to dispatch emergency services to residents in their time of need. Communication is critical for 9-1-1 call takers, however, residents in immensely stressful situations cannot always communicate clearly when speaking to an operator leaving emergency service personnel to discover lifesaving information on site. SMART 911 gives residents the power to bridge the gap of information the moment they dial 9-1-1 which increases the efficiency of a rapid response team. Here's how it works:

- You download the Smart 911 App or visit Smart911.com
- With only a phone number, you create a safety profile for yourself with basic information.
 - Once you create a profile you can add/remove as much information as you would like such as medical conditions, emergency contacts, property layout, number of people or pets on property and more.
- In the event you dial 9-1-1 an operator will immediately see all the lifesaving information you provided via Smart911 and dispatch emergency services according to your call.
 - In addition, if you download the SMART911 app a 9-1-1 operator can get an exact location of your phone. A cell phone without Smart 911 will only ping off the nearest cell tower and an operator will need to take the time to get a precise location from a caller.



"When an emergency call comes in, dispatchers and first responders are tasked with responding as swiftly as possible. The more information we have to do that, the better and quicker an emergency response will be," said Mayor Landek. "Smart911 helps operators know more about the individuals involved in an emergency so that we can arrive on scene ready to take action. Every Bridgeview resident should consider making a profile so that if an emergency ever occurs, they can feel confident that 9-1-1 professionals and first responders have information that helps to inform a rapid, successful response."

Smart911 is currently available in all 50 states with more than 3,500 municipalities across the country utilizing the tool to protect more than 66 million people. In addition to providing 9-1-1 operators with critical information Smart911 users can opt into Emergency alerts from local municipalities. Smart911 is private and secure; it is only made available to the 9-1-1 system in the event of an emergency call. Smart911 is designed to send the right response teams to the right location with the right information. The Smart911 App is available on the Apple Store or Google Play.
